

The Magna Carta barons #1



King John's willingness to ignore custom and abuse his rights eventually led many of the barons to rebel against him. In 12/2 there was an unsuccessful conspiracy to assassinate him involving Robert Fitz Walter and Eustace de Vesci. This plot seems to have had little effect on his treatment of the barons, and the more unjustly he behaved, the more he encouraged his opponents to organise themselves against him. Even the Archbishop of Canterbury was involved in trying to find a resolution.
